Dr Wiebe is Professor of Pediatric Emergency Medicine at the University of Texas, Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas. He is an attending physician, and former Director of the Emergency Department, Children's Medical Center of Dallas. Recent awards include recipient of the James Seidel Distinguished Service Award American Academy of Pediatrics in 2004, the EMS-C Lifetime Achievement Award, National Emergency Medical Services for Children Program in 2005, the Pioneer Leader Award, Tennessee EMS-C in 2008, and co-recipient of the 2008 EMS-C National Hero's award for the best research paper. Dr Wiebe is former Chair of the Committee on Pediatric Emergency Medicine for the American Academy of Pediatrics, and is currently Chair of the Committee on Continuing Medical Education for the AAP, and Chair of the Sub-Board on Pediatric Emergency Medicine for the American Board of Pediatrics.

JOSEPH L. WRIGHT, MD, MPH, FAAP

Dr Wright is Senior Vice President and head of the Child Health Advocacy Institute, a newly established center of excellence at Children's National Medical Center in Washington, DC. Academically, he is Professor of Pediatrics, Emergency Medicine and Health Policy at the George Washington University Schools of Medicine and Public Health, and founded the Institute for Prehospital Pediatrics and Emergency Research within the division of emergency medicine at Children's National. Dr Wright provides state-level leadership as the EMS Medical Director for Pediatrics within the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS), and also serves as senior investigator/medical director of the federally-funded Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) National Resource Center. Dr Wright has received recognition for his advocacy work throughout his career, including the Shining Star award from the Los Angeles-based Starlight Foundation, and induction into Delta Omega, the nation's public health honor society. He is currently an appointed member of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) Committee on Pediatric Emergency Medicine.
