- **What is DGIS?:** It is the Maternal and Child Health Bureau's (MCHB) Discretionary Grant Information System (DGIS), which electronically captures financial, program, performance measure and abstract data for more than 900 grants annually from the grantees.
- **DGIS Web Reports**
 - Released to the public in April 2008 to display DGIS data electronically on the Internet.
 - Uses data submitted in the DGIS data entry system by MCHB grantees as part of their performance reports.

All MCHB grantees provide budget data for each year of their grant. These budgets are broken down by source of funding and by category of service. For grantees providing direct, enabling or population-based services, budgets are also broken out by the MCHB population served.

Instructions:

- **Budget by Source of Funding for the Most Recent Application Year**

Instructions:

Legislative authority is how the funding from Congress is allocated to the MCHB programs. Title V of the Social Security Act, consisting of the Block Grants, Special Projects of Regional and National Significance (SPRANS), and Community Integrated Service Systems (CIS2) Grants, makes up the majority of the Discretionary Grant Funding. In addition to Title V, MCHB administers other Public Health Service and programs: Healthy Start, a targeted infant mortality reduction initiative; the Emergency Medical Services for Children program; the Translational Research program; the National Neonatal Nursing Screening program; the Family to Family Health Information Centers; and the Sickle Cell Disease program.

Performance measures are either percentage-based or scale-based measures. Percentage-based measures use numerators and denominators to generate the annual indicator, while scale-based measures use data collection forms to generate the annual indicator.

MCHB grantees reported on many of these performance measures during this reporting year. Some performance measures obtain the data from data source outside OIGIS, such as the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. However, MCHB grantees are not required to report on these performance measures. Other performance measures are under development and have not been released for data collection. 



- Will generate baseline data
- The Training Program does not currently have data on graduates' work with the MCH population across all long-term training programs.

PM B: Engagement in Policy Activities

- New Measure
- degree to which MCHB long-term training grantees engage in policy development, implementation, and evaluation.
- Wanted to capture trainee as well as faculty efforts
